1,262 students received a CRRSAA emergency financial aid grant as of March 31, 2021.

HEERF II Grant amounts were fixed and awarded as \$1,200 dollar block grants to each eligible student. The rationale in using this block grant modality was based on the guidance received by FSA that students should have "exceptional need" when considering them for funding. The College and the HEERF II Committee decided that Pell grant and/or NJ State Tuition Aid Grant eligible students are students who have exceptional need and therefore a block grant would be the most equitable way of distributing the funds.

The College of New Jersey has communicated to students through emails the eligibility criteria used, award amounts given and timeline for distribution of funds. We have also updated our CARES Act website (https://financialaid.tcnj.edu/caresact/) with the latest information available on HEERF II eligibility and included information on the Special Circumstance process at TCNJ for reevaluations of the FAFSA income reported based on job loss, decreases in income, etc.
