



2017 - 2018 High School Completion Status Information

Your 2017–2018 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. High School Completion Status

Please provide one of the following documents to the TCNJ Admissions Office that indicates the student's high school completion status prior to when the student will begin college in 2017 - 2018:

- A copy of the student's high school diploma.
- A copy of the student's final official high school transcript that shows the date when the diploma was awarded.
- A copy of the student's General Educational Development (GED) certificate or GED transcript.
- An academic transcript that indicates the student successfully completed at least a two-year program that is acceptable for full credit toward a bachelor's degree.

It is your responsibility to confirm that the information listed above has been submitted to the TCNJ Admissions Office as soon as possible. On a weekly basis OSFA will check with the Admissions Office to confirm receipt of this information. Failure to submit this documentation may result in delays to your financial aid file, late fees and possible de-registration from classes.
