Financial Assistance

At TCNJ financial aid eligibility is determined by two offices:

- The Office of Admissions determines eligibility for institutional meritbased scholarships and grants
 - If the student is eligible for institutional merit aid, the student would have been notified of such during their initial admissions acceptance AND the amount will be included in the student's estimated aid summary
 - Questions regarding meritbased eligibility can be directed to the Office of Admissions

Financial Assistance - FAFSA

The FAFSA delays have significantly inpacted our ability to process information and prepare estimated awards

- FAFSA data being sent to schools at this time, but
- The data sent is incomplete or erroneous, and
- Students/families will not be able to make corrections to the FAFSA information until mid-April, at the earliest, therefore
- Finalized data will be available at the end of April
- We anticipate that estimated award notices will be sent in mid-May
- The deposit deadline has been extended until June 1

It is not too late to apply – most lenders require that the school has a FAFSA on file for the student to apply for student loans

Estimated Aid Notices

Once the estimates are ready, emails will be sent to the email address used by the STUDENT on the Common Application, with instructions on how to view the estimated aid amounts on their admissions portal

- Only COMPLETE records receive an aid award notice
- No action on awards (accept/decline) is required
 - For planning/budgeting purposes
 official offers are sent in late
 June/early July

The above COA budget represents the estimated cost to attend TCNJ for one academic year based on 2023-24 expenses. As a State school, final costs for 2024-25 will not be determined until after the Governor signs the NJ State budget in July. Families should anticipate a 3% increase in overall costs during their budgeting.

*The 2024-25 FAFSA no longer asks students what their housing preference will be during the academic year (on or off campus). Therefore, all COA budgets are based on an on-campus residency cost.

<u>Direct costs</u> are expenses that <u>are billed</u> by the College on a semester basis. For an on-campus residential student, tuition, mandatory fees, housing and food represent direct costs. For an off campus/commuter student, tuition and mandatory fees represent direct costs.

<u>Indirect costs</u> are expenses that are <u>not billed</u> by the College. These costs represent estimates for out-of-pocket expenses that a student may incur during the academic year. Books/Supplies, Personal/Misc. and Transportation represent indirect costs. Therefore, families should budget for these expenses.

There may be differences between your actual costs and these estimates based on fees specific to certain courses, type of meal plan chosen, health insurance plan (if selected) and/or other academically related expenses.

Awarding Notes

- We award students the aid they are eligible to receive, including federal loans, based on the FAFSA results. We do not include student/parent private loans as part of the initial award since those loans require a credit check.
- Students who do not want federal loans can decline them when official awards are sent during the latter part of June/early July.
- Parents who will be applying for loans on behalf of their student, we recommend they begin the application process in June.
- Loan Options:
 - Parents can apply for federal parent loans (PLUS)
 - Parents/Students can apply for State of New Jersey loans (NJCLASS) or private loans.

- Private loans will be split by semester (1/2 Fall 1/2 Spring) unless otherwise directed on the loan application.

• You are required to report all private scholarships that you will receive for the 2024-2025 school year.


Online form will be available after June 10, 2024

- Once reported we will include the scholarship as part of your financial aid awards.
- TCNJ will give you <u>a temporary credit</u> on your TCNJ bill until the scholarship funds are received.
 - The temporary credit expires 30 days after the start of the semester if the scholarship funds have not been received by TCNJ.


